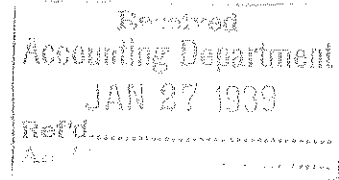

Dear Bud:-

One matter which I did not cover by my memorandum to you listing the "Duties of the Fairway Club Secretary" was the award of the three special trophies, which are as follows:-

The Charles H. Cox Memorial Trophy - (now held by Walter Cox) which is to be awarded to the low net score winner at the Merion Match each year, to be marked with his name and held by him until the following year.

The Skytop Trophy - which is to be awarded each year to the winner of the thirty-six hole match play against par, using 3/4 handicaps, at Skytop and to be held for one year.

The President's Cup - which is to be awarded to the low net winner at Aronimink, to be marked with his name and to be held for one year.

Each of these three trophies are, I believe, to become the permanent possession of the first person to win them three times.
